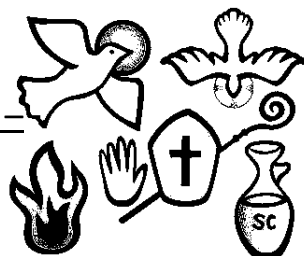

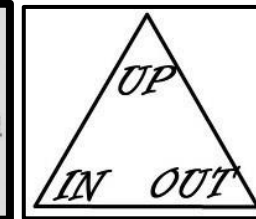

COLLECT (BCP 1662) 3rd after Trinity *O Lord, we beseech thee mercifully to hear us; and grant that we, to whom thou hast given an hearty desire to pray; may by they might aid be defended and comforted in all dangers and adversities; through Jesus Christ our Lord.*

COLLECT (CW) Birth of John the Baptist *Almighty God, by whose providence your servant John the Baptist was wonderfully born, and sent to prepare the way of your Son our Saviour by the preaching of repentance; lead us to repent according to his preaching and after his example, constantly to speak the truth, boldly to rebuke vice, and patiently to suffer for the truth's sake; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.*
