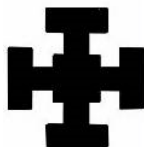

COLLECT (BCP) Epiphany 3 Almighty and everlasting God, who dost govern all things in heaven and earth: Mercifully hear the supplications of thy people and grant us thy peace all the days of our life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

COLLECT (CW) Epiphany 3 God of all mercy your Son proclaimed good news to the poor, release to the captives, and freedom to the oppressed: anoint us with your Holy Spirit and set all your people free to praise you in Christ our Lord.

COLLECT (BCP) Epiphany 4 Almighty and everlasting God, mercifully look upon our infirmities, and in all our dangers and necessities stretch forth thy right hand to help and defend us; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
