TWO NEW GROUPS STARTING AT ST GILES' CHURCH!

On Monday 1st June 2026 two new and informal groups will be starting in the social space at the back of St Giles' church, and it's hoped that both will become a monthly event on the calendar, every first Monday of the month. At 10:00 am there will be a Prayer Meeting. All are welcome to attend – no experience necessary! Then at 10:30 am we will be starting an informal Bereavement Group. We hope that this will give people the opportunity to chat with those who have also lost a loved one, whether that is a partner, child or pet. Our journeys are all different, but we hope that you will find strength and encouragement as you learn to live with your loss.

ROTARY SPECTACLES UPDATE

Rotary Redundant Spectacles for Africa - so far this year we have collected approaching 800 pairs of redundant spectacles for the Rotary International initiative which sends them to West Africa. At this moment I have 450 pairs boxed ready for dispatch. Obviously half of what we collect come from the Lichfield Branch of Vision Express and from David Arthur Opticians in Lichfield's Market Street, but the other half come from thoughtful donations from at least seven local church congregations. To me this is practical Christianity, in that it is helping people who are, in effect, disadvantaged 'neighbours'; and it is also avoiding unnecessary items being sent to landfill.
